CCR and CatalogXpress™ Data added to the CAGE Database

Now the HAYSTACK CAGE Database provides even more (and more current!) information on government contractors. With these two new additions, the HAYSTACK CAGE Database is truly your one-stop resource, helping you to quickly get in touch with suppliers and speed the purchasing process. The CCR (Central Contractor Registry) data includes CCR numbers, CCR expiration dates, point-of-contact names, addresses, phone and fax numbers, e-mail addresses, DUNS numbers, business type information, and SIC codes. And, the new CatalogXpress tab provides Web site links, plus more addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses.

Federal Agency and GSA Procurement History Databases

These two new databases will help you quickly learn from whom the government is purchasing items and services, the prices paid, the frequency of purchase, and more. The new Federal Agency Procurement History Database contains data from over 100 local and federal agencies and covers purchases of services or goods not traceable to NSNs. It details purchases of maintenance, repair, R & D, rental, charter, ADP processing, and other services, as well as equipment modifications. The GSA (General Services Administration) Procurement History covers purchases of items from GSA contracts and includes GSA schedule numbers, CEC numbers, contractor names and addresses, NSNs and SINS, performance locations, and contract dates.

Repair end items and locate older aircraft parts.

D049 Air Force Master Material Support Record

The D049 database is especially helpful to those who repair Air Force end items and weapon systems. For listed end items, it outlines the complete range of component parts, any special tools or equipment you may need, and the technical orders that apply. The Air Force Logistics Command no longer updates this database, but the aviation community still finds it invaluable. Using the D049 you can find the manufacturers of hundreds of older parts that are no longer listed in the FLIS database. You can search the D049 by part number, NIIN, Control Number, CAGE, CAGE/Part, Noun, Company, and E_Control. You will also find a timesaving cross-reference button at the bottom of HAYSTACK FLIS records when additional information is available in the D049.

New databases. New capabilities!

Find alternate manufacturers of aviation equipment.

PMA (Parts Manufacturer Authority) Database

Manufacturers of parts not included on an aircraft when it is Type Certified must obtain special approval from the FAA. The PMA database lists the OEM's name, address, part number, part description, and the model number of the aircraft for which the part was designed, as well as the PMA holder's name, address, and part information.

Using the PMA database:

- Maintenance engineers, mechanics, and aircraft owners/operators can find alternate suppliers and verify parts approval.
- Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) and PMA manufacturers can research their competitors.
- Acquisition searchers can locate potential acquisition targets.
- Aviation marketers can build prospect lists.

You can search the database directly, but maybe even more importantly, every time you search the FLIS and an NSN match is found in the PMA database you get an automatic cross-reference.

Find replacements for older NATO parts.

Historical NATO NSNs

Here's a database that will be especially useful to Joint Military environments and FMS (Foreign Military Sales) contractors. We've merged a comprehensive file of historical NATO National Stock Numbers with the HAYSTACK FLIS database. Now you can search the FLIS by the old NATO NIIN, CAGE code, part number, or item name and easily retrieve replacement information.

Have an old Navy NICN? Here's how to find the current NIIN.

CHAIN (Consolidated History of Alternate Identification Numbers) Database

The Navy's CHAIN Database is a record of NICN/NIIN changes. Search the database by an old NICN, and you will instantly find the preferred NIIN. Then, you can use the NIIN to search the FLIS and other HAYSTACK databases to determine preferred items, substitutes, alternate identification numbers, and more – all in a matter of minutes. The Navy no longer updates the CHAIN database – but HAYSTACK Online gives you this helpful historical information.

Source high reliability military parts.

QPL (Qualified Products Lists) Database

Now you can quickly find commercial sources for Military parts! Just search by Mil Spec number in the new QPL database. The database contains the complete text of all current U.S. Military and Federal QPLs – more than 1,200 documents covering 1.5 million products, plus information on SMD (Standard Military Drawing) part numbers.
